Ron Barnett - Twinning



I was delighted to host Rotarian Ron Barnett, who gave a very informative and interesting insight into the Banbury Twinning Association which he has been involved with from its early days.

He told us Banbury is twinned with two towns, Ermont in France and Hennef in Germany.

He very colourfully detailed some of his trips to those towns and their return visits. There have been many local organisation, clubs, schools and societies who have benefited from the cultural exchanges over the years and many friendships have evolved so much so that some members will visit frequently organised events. Twinning has become much more difficult in recent years due to financial constraints but they continue to do as much as they can.

Ron continued to detail some of the characters and their escapades, much to the amusement of our members and there were quite a few questions at the end of his presentation.

We are all grateful for Ron stepping in at short notice and entertaining us with his colourful and enthusiastic description of Twinning in Banbury. Many thanks Ron.

Rtn. John Groves - My Life Talk



On 21<sup>st</sup> April, we had the pleasure of hearing about the life of our new member, John Groves. John illustrated his talk with a variety of highly amusing animated slides which resulted in much laughter from his fellow Rotarians.

Despite being born in Wales, John moved to Portsmouth two years later and considers himself to be a true Englishman, although on some occasions, for instance rugby, he would like to think he was Welsh. Life in primary school was difficult as John suffered difficulties of coordination which had a detrimental impact on his progress. He made up for this, however, with plenty of activity outside school, the most significant of which was the purchase of a science book at a church jumble sale which started John's love of Science.

Now living in Coventry, at Secondary Modern School, John's dexterity improved. Within a year he

moved from being bottom to being top of the class. At age 13, he swapped to a new comprehensive school which meant that he was able to take Olevels. Leaving school at 16, he started work, progressing from a Chemical Plant Technician Apprentice to becoming a Chartered Chemist at the age of 21.

After a period in industry, John moved into academia and studied at Coventry Polytechnic, gaining a doctorate before moving to a research and teaching post for two years at the Memorial University in Canada. He moved back to the UK in 1971 and became a Chemistry Teacher at Banbury School where he remained until 2002. John rose through the ranks to become Acting Principal and Senior Vice-Principal. Outside the classroom, he ran the youth club at Cropredy, organised school events including science events for teachers and students across Oxfordshire, worked for Exam Boards and wrote various science textbooks.

After leaving Banbury School, John undertook consultancy work for a while prior to undertaking a web-design course which set him on a new path working in web-design and educational computer simulations both in the UK and USA. One of his web-designs attracted 20 million page views per annum and his Educational Physics software was awarded 'Best in Show' in the annual British Educational Training and Technology Show.

In 2015, John headed up the Bloxham Neighbourhood Plan which, in late 2016, saw 97% of the residents voting in favour of the Plan and in January 2018, it entered into local Planning Law.

Wolf Run


